C. 17/04/03 Consideration of the Parish Council's response to Rushcliffe Core Strategy Part 2 Consultation

Four additional greenfield housing sites had been put forward to Rushcliffe Borough Council for consideration. Councillors considered the comments made by members of the public during the Annual Parish Meeting relating to the consultation. Councillors were disappointed that the potential greenfield housing site consultation for Ruddington was not carried out all at the same

time and wished this to be expressed to Rushcliffe Borough Council as part of the consultation response.

Following a show of hands it was RESOLVED that the following responses would be given:

Housing development would not be supported at site RUD11
Housing development would not be supported at site RUD12
Housing development would be supported for the whole of site RUD13
Housing development would not be supported at site RUD14
No other sites would be suggested

Additionally it was agreed that the Chairman & Clerk would draft a response to be circulated to Councillors prior to submission to express concerns regarding the pressure new housing would place on the road infrastructure within the village, a desire to prevent coalescence with nearby settlements and a desire to preserve the village identity, a preference for a larger number of small scale developments rather than large developments and the view that no more than 250 new homes should be accommodated on greenfield sites at Ruddington.
