Traffic and Transport Plan for Ruddington

This is the final draft of the Plan. The Plan will influence how RPC responds to traffic and transport matters, including housing and employment developments both within Ruddington and nearby. It has been drawn up following consultation with local residents and businesses and the intention is that it will be reviewed annually.

RPC works in partnership with Notts County Council (for Highways matters) and Rushcliffe Borough Council (for development). We have received a positive response to the draft Plan from the Transport Planning team at County Hall. Where RPC can act alone, and where resources permit, we will take assertive action.

Walking in Ruddington

Ruddington Parish Council will promote walking as an activity with health gains and as a way of reducing congestion. Specifically, we will encourage parents */carers* to walk their children to and from school, which also reduces congestion around school opening and closing times.

To support this, we will campaign for more and safer crossing points at key locations in Ruddington, including the A60 Loughborough Road.

We will also continue to work in partnership with Highways to create an alternative walking route on Clifton Road so that the narrow and difficult footways on the bridge can be bypassed at ground level.

Cycling in Ruddington

RPC will promote cycling as an activity with health gains and as a way of reducing traffic congestion. We will campaign for more and improved cycle routes, especially through the centre of Ruddington.

We will campaign against cycling on the pavements and encourage enforcement action against serial offenders.

Parking in Ruddington

We will continue to seek ways to provide additional parking to support our local businesses. This will include public parking and parking for staff working in Ruddington.

Information on developing a Residents Parking Scheme will be publicised and made available to those requesting it.

We will seek ways of providing better enforcement of parking restrictions in the village core. Roads which have been identified as having particular problems at specific times will be targeted. We will encourage the County Council to review the strength and weaknesses of the most recent parking regulations. In particular we will campaign for the provision of disabled parking bays adjacent to the library and the doctors' surgeries.

HGV's

We will find measures to discourage the use of Ruddington as a 'cut through' between the A453 and the A60. Goods vehicles belonging to local employers will be exempt.

We will monitor the use of the A60 by HGV's in the very early mornings and, if necessary, campaign against the noise nuisance caused to local residents.

Traffic management

Besides HGV's, Ruddington's streets are used by non-residents in ways that contribute to congestion. We will promote Ruddington as a village, not as a town. This does not ultimately rule out the future development of a one-way system but currently opinion is divided, there are no funds available within Highways to pursue the idea, and such a development could be inconsistent with enhancing Ruddington as looking and feeling like a village.

We will resist developments that are likely to add more vehicles to the village's congested streets without significant improvements being made. We will support road improvements funded by developments only where they will clearly enhance Ruddington as a village, both in terms of relieving congestion, managing speed, and improving the 'look and feel'.

We recognise that the look and feel of a village can be enhanced by traffic calming measures (not speed bumps) which will discourage some drivers from using the village as a cut through. Road markings, natural chicanes and other measures with only modest costs associated could be included in a traffic calming scheme.

We will therefore take steps to encourage all Ruddington residents to respect the restrictions of the village roads and we will campaign for measures which will reduce the traffic speed. We will campaign for a 20mph limit throughout the village core.

Additional measures to deter all-day parking (except for residents) would be included at the same time.

We will seek improvements to the traffic light controlled junction of Kirk Lane and the A60.

Public transport

We will encourage the use of public transport to relieve congestion and enhance the environment.

We will campaign for improved public transport links to the QMC, to West Bridgford town centre, and to the city and the Midland Railway Station. We will campaign for junction improvements and bus lanes to be introduced to reduce journey times.

We will campaign for the development of a Park and Ride site south of Ruddington with fast public transport links to the city.

We will seek to extend the electronic information displays to all bus stops in Ruddington.

Update for Parish Council after meeting with Roger Davis 6/3/2015 Relating to possible 'land swap' of Sellors

GH = Geo Hallam's. RD = Roger Davis

- Bloors have an option on land both north & south of Packman Dyke. The land to the north (shown as public open space on the diagrams put out by Bloors is unlikely to be developed for housing due to flooding & ground level issues (as well as probably not getting planning permission!)
- 2. Bloors have informed RD that discussions with RBC have been generally positive. Bloors are looking at submitting a planning application around June.
- 3. No precise valuation on Sellor's but estimate that new Community Hall (depending on what is required) could be funded from sale of Sellor's.
- 4. Assuming this goes ahead RD recommends negotiating a price for Sellor's. Go out to tender for building of the new Community Hall, including Bloors in the list of tenderers. GH to provide detailed specification based on RPC requirements.
- 5. GH can provide estimated building costs of a new Community Hall once it is known what is required.
- 6. Bloor's would be interested in RPC taking over as much of the land north of Packman Dyke as willing to take on. There would be a covenant on this land (put on by existing owner) to restrict it to leisure uses. RD informed that RPC will NOT take on the balancing pond. Discussion over exact boundary and responsibility for Packman Dyke (Commonly it would be used as a boundary and each landowner would be responsible up to the middle).
- 7. Asked RD to get GH to do a 'call out' for any possible sites for a new community centre in the middle of Ruddington.
- 8. Made RD aware of issues of timing with RPC making decisions over an election period i.e. not too close before elections & not too quickly (e.g. at first meeting!) afterwards. AW & GDL made it clear that there can be no guarantee of RPC moving forward with the proposal or supporting a planning application (even if have agreed proposal subject to planning permission may decide to make no comment on the application itself).

REPORT FROM THE STEERING GROUP OF THE RUDDINGTON VILLAGE PLAN

Parish Council meeting 10th March 2015

The group has been playing catch-up at the last three meetings as a result of the Christmas and New Year break and the cancelled January meeting.

In February we had six guests to help with questions related to Health & Welfare, which was a good thing because we had several members of the Steering Group absent from that meeting. This section was completed at the follow-up meeting and a further section of the questionnaire was also completed at the mid-February meeting.

Now that the project is progressing, the group has been able to outline a timescale for the consultation period.

The draft questions will be completed by the end of May, reviewed, finalised and printed during June and July.

Public consultation events will be held during August and early September and at the same time online questionnaires will be made available so that residents can see what we are consulting about.

The printed consultation questionnaire will be distributed early in September and collected towards the end of the same month.

From August the group will be able to start collating and analysing the responses as they come in
